



From the Principal's Desk 2021-22

Yet again, it is that time of the year when we put together a piece of history, in our annual issue of the college magazine, to allow future generations a glimpse into the glorious and eventful past of the institution. Yet, this time there is a difference! I realise that I will be penning these lines for the last time as Head of this premier and wonderful institution; as the academic year draws to a close and as we try to return to our normal academic terms after the disarray in which the ravages of the pandemic had left us, I shall be laying down office on attainment of superannuation on the 30th of June 2022! (having been granted a year of extension to serve the institution) The realization takes me on a swift walk down memory lane, from the day I assumed charge of this prestigious office on 1st August 2009 to 13 years later as I prepare to lay down office and all the milestones along the way, a memorable journey indeed!

When I joined as Principal of this institution, I was the first lady Principal of the institution! Expectations were huge and every eye amongst the teaching and administrative staff of the college was skeptically sizing me up to see whether I would be able to meet up to those expectations built on the rich past of illustrious leaders, dedicated faculty and brilliant academic and co-curricular performances of students.

Housed at the time in a heritage complex owned by one of the departments of the government of Goa, the college presented its own peculiar challenges which made the prospect of expansion and introduction of new programs a distant reality; To begin with therefore, I focused on strengthening the existing programs and overcoming the infrastructural weaknesses. Bringing the students back to the classrooms from the parapet along the slopes of the road to Altinho was a challenge in a class of its own, which was also successfully surmounted but not before shaking up the political, administrative and academic circles and announcing to the world at large that S S Dempo College means business! Not to forget mention of student council elections, notorious in the past, some firm action, to the extent of not having a student council one year, ensured that we sent out the right signals! Student elections became so transparent and above board that for the first time in 50 years we even had a girl student elected to the coveted post of General Secretary in the year 2016-17! Leading the institution through two cycles of NAAC assessment and accreditation and ensuring enhancement of quality across all parameters to earn 'A' Grade with a CGPA of 3.30 in the 3rd Cycle was another important feather in our cap! Academic excellence being paramount among all others, we were assured of being on the right path when 5 of the first 10 Goa University ranks in Commerce undergraduate exams were bagged by students of our college in the year 2016-17! The achievement was all the more gratifying in learning that all the achievers were girls!

With most things being under control, the frequent question that stakeholders across the spectrum would ask of me was 'when will the college have a campus of its own?' I would promptly turn the question to our Trustees who would always be positive and say it will happen soon! After patiently waiting for what seemed like forever, the construction for the new campus finally began in 2014 and we shifted into our very own 'vastu', a spacious, well ventilated, bright and state-ofthe-art facility in January 2017, in the 51st year after the college was established!The campus was inaugurated by the Honourable Union Minister for Human Resource Development, Shri Prakash Jawadekar Ji, who lauded the efforts of the Trustees and appreciating their willingness to invest so heavily in providing quality in

It was now the right time to put all our ideas and plans for expanding our portfolio pf programs and courses! The very conducive environs for teaching-learning made us 'neighbour's envy and owner's pride'! People from across the state would come to see how the campus had been minutely and methodically planned to make it a self-contained urban centre for higher education; students from across the state yearned for admission to S.S. Dempo! We increased our intake for our flagship Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) program (which now, as we had a self-owned campus, was permanently affiliated to Goa University!) Our Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) program, which had evolved into a brand in itself, was in huge demand! (we recently started the 3rd division for the first year admissions) We strengthened the Post-Graduate programs in Commerce, Travel and Tourism and Event Management; we also proudly introduced the Integrated Masters of Commerce a unique, one-of-its-kind program in Goa, custom-designed for advanced learners who aspire to senior levels of Finance and Accounting professions! The successful conduct of all these programs and the laudable achievements of the students graduating from them lends a gratifying sense of satisfaction!

Realising that the lament of industry that graduates are 'unemployable' could only be set aside by differentiating our graduates by developing soft and hard skills in them, we set up the Dempo Centre for Skill Development under the aegis of which a number of skill development course were offered throughout the academic year such that the students could gain several such skills in the course of their graduate/post graduate studies and be industry-ready when they pass out for the portals of our institution.

Of course, we knew that all work and no play would certainly make for dull students! As such, enrolling for N.C.C., volunteering for N.S.S., participating in sports and co-curricular activities were given their due importance and support which helped students earn laurels for themselves and the institution. We built brands in inter-collegiate student festivals, be it the re-invented K-OSS, or the BBA event Rannbhoomi or Biz-Quest, the annual business quiz introduced to commemorate our Founder's day, colleges from all over Goa wanted to be there as there was nothing bigger or better than S.S.Dempo events! We built brands in placement and student counselling activities as well, Edu-Next became an annual platform that attracted service providers, galaxy of motivating resource persons along with parents and students who were service seekers.

While predominantly serving our students, the institution did more than its fair share in encouraging the professional development and welfare of the teaching faculty and the non-teaching staff; be it facilities for undertaking doctoral studies, attending professional development programs, organizing conferences, workshops, seminars and training sessions, the college provides ample opportunities! I am particularly delighted to cite that while we had only 3 doctorates, including me, when I joined as Principal, today the number is -----.

Although I can continue on this heady flashback trip, let me conclude by placing on record emphatically that none of this would have been possible if not for the constant encouragement, support and generosity of the Trustees of Dempo Charities Trust, Mr Shrinivas Dempo, Ms Pallavi Dempo, the late Mr Vishwas Rao Dempo and Mr. Yatish Dempo. My humble gratitude to them for entrusting this prestigious institution into my hands and for empowering me to take up responsibilities beyond the scope of my duties; I will leave with a sense of satisfaction for having contributed to keeping aloft the banner of S. S. Dempo!

Administrators, Shri Sunil Prabhudesai earlier and now Shri Rajesh Bhatikar invariably gave wings to my flights of fancy and allowed me to soar higher in the interest of the students, staff and other stakeholders! I am indebted to them!

The Directors of the Directorate of Higher Education, Shri Bhaskar Nayak earlier and Shri Prasad Lolayekar now, believed in me; it enabled me to do many things which others thought impossible! I shall always be grateful to them!

The Goa University has always been supportive of the efforts of S. S. Dempo College; I must however specially mention the opportunities and platforms provided by Vice Chancellor Professor Varun Sahni; he was all for the innovative academic program that we had designed; he strongly supported it all the way through its approval in university bodies; he often cited it as a best practice which made us proud of our efforts! A champion of the need to empower women, He always found women for suitable responsibilities in the university system. I was certainly a beneficiary of his progressive ideas; he appointed me first as Coordinator of the College Development Council and then when the opportunity came along, encouraged me to take up the additional responsibility of officiating as Registrar of Goa University alongside my primary duties of Principal! It was an exciting period of 13 months of learning and being catapulted onto the centre stage of higher education in the state of Goa! I can never thank Professor Sahni enough!

My peer principals, the Forum of Principals and my colleagues on the executive committee of the Forum always provided a respectful acceptance to me and to all that we did at S. S. Dempo College. It enabled us to contribute to the cause of improving the transaction of higher education in the state.

One may wonder as to how I was able to manage so many things at the same time! Much of it was due to the committed and untiring efforts of successive Vice Principals who were part of the team! Vice Principal Nikhil Varerkar who hand held me in the first few years of donning the mantle of Principal! He taught me to read in between the lines, see the larger picture, learn all the ropes while being aware of the strings attached and generally to plant my feet firmly on the ground to take decisions, some easy and many not so easy at all! Vice Principal Harip Khanapuri succeeded him for two terms; could anyone be as unassuming as him, be available 24x7 to students, parents, colleagues and other stakeholders, at the same time be immersed in upgrading himself academically and in his research activities, be a role model as a teacher, lead by example in subject expertise and yet be the fun-loving foodie and Netflix addict that he is? Well, one has to work with him to realise the truth in all of this! S.S. Dempo College bid a tearful goodbye to him when he decided to join the Goa Business School at Goa University regretting the fact that all of us together could not deter him from his decision of moving on! Next came Vice Principal CA Gauri Tamba; she was the calming influence on all my exuberance; we made a perfect team, I would sketch the outlines of the big picture and she would fill in the finer strokes, meticulously, painstakingly and methodically. She handed over charge to the present Vice Principal, Dr. Aruna Mesquita e Noronha, whose sense of duty, commitment, integrity and dedication to the institution is inversely proportionate to her diminutive size. I feel safe to leave the institution in her officiating care and trust that someday soon she will qualify to be eligible for the post of Principal.

I never cease to attribute the success the college attains to the untiring efforts, cooperation and selfless commitment of the teaching faculty, administrative and support staff! Together, we have braved many a storm and enjoyed quite a few successes! They are the strong pillars on which we build the institution and help it scale greater heights! I am thankful for the team that we have built, over the years, on mutual trust and confidence! I rely on them to take the institution forward in the challenging times that lie ahead with the structural changes going to be necessitated by the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020.

Let me end by paying respectful homage to the former Chief Minister of Goa, former Defense Minister of the nation, M.L.A. of Panaji constituency, 'Bhaie' to those who loved him, who had a soft corner for S.S. Dempo College, which was part of Panaji constituency till we moved to the new campus and who I placed on the pedestal of a role model; The Cujira Education Complex in which our new campus is housed was a result of his visionary foresight! He allowed me to have my place in the sun not only in higher education but in local governance as well; he trusted me with some difficult and sensitive assignments; often impatient, but many times indulgent, he inspired me to go beyond my known capabilities and explore the unknown! Goa and higher education in particular is on strong foundations because of the vision you shared with those who are taking it forward today, Sir! Thank you for all that you have done for us!

I wish the college huge and successful strides in enhancing and ensuring quality in higher education! On my part, I may leave S. S. Dempo but S. S. Dempo will always remain an important part of me! After all, 'once a Dempoite...always a Dempoite'!!



Practical Ways of learning

Students of FY BBA were taken on a study tour as part of the Culture Heritage course. The tour was organised in association with Soul Travelling Co. who explained the historical importance of the sites visited. Sites visited were Fort Aguada and Old Goa. Some locations covered were Gateway to Palace of Adil Shah, St. Cathedral, The Arch of Viceroy, The house of bull, St. Cajetan Church and St. Catherine Chapel.

FY BBA students had a field visit to the Albertina Almeida Field, managed as a community initiative to foster the spirit of community working and sustainable farming. Some objectives of the visit were to learn about the biodiversity of fauna and flora, topography of the land, groundwater table, etc.

Students of FY BBA were taken for a field visit to Anagha Wachasundar Pratishthan as a part of Individual and Society course. The motive was to sensitize students to children having different abilities and to empathize with these children. They had a tour of the entire school and classroom system and witnessed a class being conducted for the children.

The SY BBA students had an industrial visit to a 3D printing company in Verna, 3D Infinyt and a Packaging machine manufacturing company, Syntegon, in Verna Industrial Estate. Infinity 3D aids in the creation and printing of 3D models, prototypes, spares, tools, artificial limbs, scale models, gifts and accessories, and so on. The instructor provided the students with a thorough understanding of the 3D printing process and its various types. He displayed some of the items they had created in their lab. He showed pictures of many of them in physical form. Students also observed a product being manufactured. The instructor then demonstrated how to use the 3D printing pen to create some small items. The students had a great time making their own items with the pen.

Syntegon, previously known as Bosch Packaging Technology is widely regarded as the cradle of German packaging machinery manufacturing. The instructor gave students a wonderful tour of the factory. He told them about the various packaging machinery that they produce.

Members of the finance club, 'Financetory', accompanied by Asst. Professor Vishwa Naik Raiker, attended the half day awareness meet of MSME's in Goa. The number of students attending the same was 15. The primary aim of this meet was to make the final year students and aspiring MSME entrepreneurs aware of the MSME movement in India.

Members of Financetory visited Mangal Analytics and Research Consulting, Panjim. MARC is a research and analytics company that provides strategic advice to domestic as well as international clientele. They deal with financial and marketing services like market research, and MSI for a company. The students interacted with the executives of MARC. Financetory members visited HDFC AMC, Panjim, where they were informed about company as a whole and what their functions entail along with the departments and also the opportunities during the pandemic. It was a fruitful and productive day with a lot of learnings.

Every academic year the students are inducted into the department through the GU-Admission Ranking Test (GUART) for which they need to access the Goa University website. The department conducted both academic and non-academic activities to ensure the holistic growth of the students enrolled in this programme. The department is managed by Programme Coordinator, Dr. Cheryl Venan Dias and department faculty Asst. Prof. Yash B. Prabhugaonkar

Academic Events:

1. The department of MTTM organised an International Webinar on 'Getting Ahead in a Job Interview' by resource person Prof. Dr. Mihir Nayak, from Thorsten Edu, Germany on the 23rd September, 2021. The talk was attended by 27 students of the MTTM Department. 2. Hosted an intercollegiate debate on the occasion of World Tourism Day on 27th, September 2021 in collaboration with the Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India, Incredible India.

3. Gym orientation on resources and physical activities held in the college was organised for MTTM Part 1 students on 5th October, 2021 by college Physical Director Dr. Michael Dias as part of their orientation session.

4. The MTTM department in collaboration with the Institution Innovation Council (IIC) of S.S. Dempo College of Commerce and Economics organised a one-hour talk My Story – Motivational session by entrepreneur/ start-up founder Ms. Maria Victor (Founder/CEO - Make It Happen) on 22nd November, 2021. Ms. Maria spoke about the essentials of developing an entrepreneurial approach and also shared how the idea of Make it Happen was conceived and implemented. The session was attended by 26 participants. 5. The P.G. students of DCTs, S.S. Dempo College of Commerce and Economics, Master of Tourism and Travel Management (MTTM) under the guidance of Dr. Cheryl Venan Dias and Asst. Prof. Yash Prabhugaonkar participated in the National Level event Entrada-21, everything counts on the theme - Tourism for Inclusive Growth, hosted by BBA-Travel and Tourism Department, Rosary College of Commerce and Arts, Navelim between 6th to 13th November, 2021. The team won prizes in various competitions, and were able to test their skills in project management, photography, app design, case analysis, tour management, destination revival, navigation, and stress interview. They also showcased their talent in singing and creativity during the online event.

6. The P.G. Department of Tourism Studies (MTTM), in association with IIC, organised an IPR orientation session through a Case Study method on 7th March, 2022. Students has to analyse the case and deliberate about the early life of Walt Disney, his motivations for his creativity, the dealings with distributors and ultimately losing one of his creatives due to a mindless signoff. Students also noted how Walt Disney overcame the challenges and also managed to protect the copyrights of his next creative genius 'Mickey Mouse'. The activity was held in an offline mode with 25 students of MTTM attending the session mentored by the department faculty.

7. Library orientation was organised for the students of Part 1 and 2 on 21st March, 2022.

8. The PG Department of Tourism Studies (MTTM) of S.S. Dempo College of Commerce and Economics, Cujira organized Industry Internship Presentations for second-year students on Monday, 18th April, 2022. They were the first batch to start with industry internships after the pandemic. The students are given an internship handbook to guide them through the process,

individual guides assisted the students with the internship that they want to pursue during the summer break. The students' presentations were adjudicated by industry professionals, such as Mr. Varun Hegde, Proprietor of Soul Travel; Mrs. Maria Georgia Victor, Proprietor of Make It Happen; Mr. Darren Stuart, HR Head b:live and Mr. James Rebello, Operations Manager b:live. Seventeen students gave an overview of the organization that they worked with, problems identified during their tenure, and shared their contributions and suggestions. The students interned with leading hotel brands, F&B Companies, automobile industry, manufacturing industry, content development, TV production, Luxury Tent Experiences with OTDC, NGOs, Tour Operations and Online Travel Agencies in functional areas such as Production, HR, Finance and Accounting, Quality Management, Travel Photography, Travel Analytics, Social Media Marketing, and Web Content Management. The students got an opportunity to interact with the judges and had a thought-provoking Q&A session.

9. Organized a visit to CIBA on 23rd April, 2022, Centre for Incubation and Business Acceleration, Verna in collaboration with IIC to familiarise students with start-up incubation facilities and funding opportunities as part of the Entrepreneurship in Tourism Subject. The students actively participated in the presentation and Q&A session.

10. Organised a study tour to Coorg as a fieldbased study activity from 7th -11th May, 2022. A total of eleven students joined the tour. The major focus was to observe the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and challenges of operating a home stay, and the challenges of tour operators while conducting the tour - operational factors, the costing and sustainable tourism products that

are included in the tour. Students had to submit an online report which highlighted the above observations and also suggest if the homestay models are a sustainable option for Goa. They also had to derive a sustainable model for the state of Goa, and submit a photo essay of their experiences while visiting eco-tourism spots as well as provide an analysis of Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remain Act 1958 (AMASR Act and Antiguities and Art Treasures Act 1972) while visiting ancient monuments and the artefacts housed in the monuments and museums. The students were given full autonomy to select the tour operator based on the services and facilities provided. The costing was made more feasible by using the break-up system which allowed the combination of various costeffective elements of the tour package.

11. The students of MTTM reported their field visits to Pilar Museum, Goa Chitra, Se Cathedral Museum, and Coorg Fort and Museum as part of the Ethical, Legal and Regulatory Aspect of Tourism. The duration of the study was spread from 25th April to 13th May, 2022. During their course of fieldwork, students were required to find the monuments protected under the AMASR Act 1958, and AATA Act of 1971, find the oldest artefact in the museum and describe the role of ASI and the State Archaeology Department in the preservation of Goan heritage. The students presented their findings and suggestions in form of a flipbook.

Academic- Skill Development

The session was attended by three faculty and 16 students of the MTTM department.

Dr. Aruna Mesquita, Vice-Principal of the College presented a memento to CA Saish Naik.





Library

College library book collection has been increased with the addition of 1360 books to its existing collection. This includes books for BCom and other self-finance courses of the college. The total library book collection stands at 45,860 books. The library also subscribes to research journals, magazines and newspapers required for general reading and research work.

The library has automated its functioning with the Library Integrated Management Software 'NEW GEN LIB'. To gain a count of the daily visitors to the library, there is a computerised check-in and check-out system.

The library web page on the college website at https://dempocollege.edu.in/ provides access to the library resources and services. OPAC (search library books) on the library page provides library book data, book circulation service, question papers, subscribed e-resources, students' projects, new arrivals, links to faculty PhD thesis and other open access journals and newspapers.

Library subscribes to N-LIST services of INFLIBNET that contain online books and journals from various publishers. Additionally, the library subscribes to J-GATE: Social and Management Sciences (JSMS), an electronic gateway to global e-journal literature related to social and management sciences domain.

Other e-resources available are CMIE (Economic Outlook) and CMIE Prowess for interactive querying, a database of the financials of Indian Companies.

Remote access to these online resources is available to library users.

Activities:

A library orientation was arranged to introduce students to the automated library system. The session was divided into two parts. The first part covered library rules, procedures, library collection, borrowing facility, services, N-List and J-Gate resources and other library activities. The second part covered live demonstrations of various features of the library web page on the college website. This included 'My Library', where users can check their library account, question papers, databases, online free journals, virtual references, faculty PhD thesis, etc.

The library arranged an online training session on J-Gate resources for the students of MCom and MTTM course on 21st March, 2022. Topic of the session was 'Effective use of J-Gateplus'. Resource person was Mr. Mayank from Informatics Publishing Limited.

Book Exhibitions:

Celebration of Goa Revolution Day to create awareness about the Goa freedom struggle & history of Goa among students and staff. Books, from the library collection, related to Goa's freedom struggle & history of Goa were displayed. The exhibition ran from 18th to 20th June, 2022.

National Librarian's Day was celebrated on 12th August, 2021. A book exhibition on the topic 'Library Science' was organized in the library reading hall. About 17 books and souvenirs related to library science were displayed from the library collection.



Farewell Dear Principal Dr Radhika Shrikant Nayak

On the morning of 1st August 2009, Dr Radhika Nayak accompanied by the Chairman of Dempo Group of Companies / Trustee- Dempo Charities Trust walked into the staff room of our Altinho-based campus. She had resigned from her long stint of 28 years at Carmel College for women, Nuvem to take over as the new Principal of DCTs S.S. Dempo College of Commerce & Economics.

Dr Radhika was new to this role as the Principal of the college but certainly not new to the teaching faculty of our institution nor the entire State of Goa. Her contribution to the teaching fraternity as President of the University and College Teachers Association of Goa (UCTAG) was remarkable where she spearheaded a number of initiatives to our benefit.

As my teacher in the subject of Economics at Carmel college where I was a student, her voice and command over the subject was remarkable. Everything she spoke and taught was so interesting. When she was appointed to lead S.S. Dempo college, I knew Dr Nayak would bring about a positive change and she certainly did not disappoint. She meant business when she hit the ground running and we have not looked back since. On day-one, she promised that she would put in efforts for a new and independent building for our institution to grow and that became a reality in the year 2017.

Khanikar Puthi

A Magnificent Holy Book

"We tried moving it across a river by carrying it in a truck. The otherwise fine vehicle couldn't start the engine when the holy book is placed," said Baruah who has been carrying the weight of this miraculous scripture on his head, literally, wherever he goes.

They say it never rains when the scripture is being carried to a place.

"Asroi lole he bristi ei paai," he said; meaning -Showers of rain pour only when they seek refuge somewhere.

Preserved by the Khanikar family in Khanikar village of Michamora which falls under the Golaghat district, the Khanikar Puthi is a combination of Mahapurush Srimanta Sankardeva's Kirtan Ghosa and Mahapurush Madhavdeva's Namghosa that is kept inside a lovely, wooden box. The tradition of sourcing the 'Puthi' dates 500 years back which is believed to be a spiritual book of miracles. It was written in Brajavali language. A skin of Xaasi (Agarwood) tree was used for writing the puthi and the skin was properly treated with medicines to ensure that insects do not infest it.

There was once an incident when the scripture was being carried- in the highs of the hills leading to Guwahati, the Puthi alongwith it's carrier had been surrounded by wild elephants. Shockingly enough, the elephants, after having surrounded the Puthi, did nothing but put a leaf on it with their trunk and crossed the road.

They say the carriers of this miraculous religious scripture never feel tired. They walk barefoot for thousands of kilometres- and you won't see a single bruise on their heels.

It is believed that when the Maans attacked Assam (1819-1821), a resident of Khanikar village, named Mani Baruah found this book and kept it safely at his residence. After the death of Mani Baruah, his family has taken the responsibility of preserving this Khanikar Puthi. Since that time until today, the book has been preserved in the Khanikar village which is the reason behind its popularity as the 'Khanikar Puthi'. Today, with the consent of the Khanikar family and the society, the place where the 'Puthi' is preserved, Namghar has been founded.

This book is carried by wearing traditional and only on the head or shoulder of the devotees to their homes, on foot to recite hymns in the hope of receiving blessings as it is said that this 'Puthi' is a wish granter and provides mental peace which made it popular amidst the people. The Kirtan Ghosa and Namghosa of the Khanikar Puthi has 105 and 53 pages respectively. It is believed that this book has completed 245 years in 2013 and has an interesting note at the end that says "যথা দষ্ট্ ং তথা লখিতিং", meaning "I produced what I saw".

People from all over the state of Assam have unflinching faith in the Puthi. It is truly worthy of detailed research. In today's context, a scientific review is a necessity of this Khanikar Puthi.




