


**AGREEMENT OF EVENT PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN

Pritha Nabar a standard 10 student of G S Amonkar Vidya Mandir, Mapusa and Aiden Trindade, a standard six student of St Britto's, Mapusa were declared winners in the senior and junior category, respectively, at the finale of Spell-Bee 2018 which was held on October 5 at Dempo House, Panaji.

The All Goa spelling competition was organised by The Navhind Times in collaboration with the department of Events Management, S S Dempo College of Commerce and Economics to enable school students to test and improve their spelling skills and cultivate a healthy competitive spirit.

Two weeks after the first round in which 370 students participated, only 40 made it to the final round and participants put up a tough fight to make it to the winners list. The finale consisted of three rounds and after two fierce rounds only 20 of the 40 made it to the third round.

The 20 finalists had to go through a gruelling time which had the audience biting their nails and sitting at the edge of their seats. Each finalist fought gallantly to stay in the race and there were ties in both categories. After an exciting tie-breaker five winners were declared in each category.

The judges for the competition were associate professor, English, St Xavier's College, Mapusa, Sunita Mesquita; associate professor, English, S S Dempo College of Commerce and Economics, Cujira, Augusto Pinto and communication skills coach and proprietor of Speaking Studio, a persona and skill development centre, Runa Menezes.

"It was a first-of-its-kind endeavour on such a large scale organised by The Navhind Times and Dempo College. I would like to congratulate both the parties for a fruitful collaboration and for giving students a platform to showcase their distinctive talents in the world of words," said Sunita Mesquita. "It was heartening to see the effort and hard work put in by the participants as well as the organisers," she added.

Winners were awarded certificates, trophies and prizes sponsored by Faber Castel and Delta Technologies. The chief guest at the valedictory function was secretary, Education department, Nila Mohanan. Speaking on the occasion she congratulated participants and encouraged the love of reading and learning spellings. Also present on the dais were principal, S S Dempo College of Commerce and Economics, Radhika Nayak and editor, The Navhind Times, Arun Sinha.

After the success of its maiden spelling competition, The Navhind Times is looking forward to the next edition in 2019.





Report of activity under MoU signed with Serendipity Arts Foundation



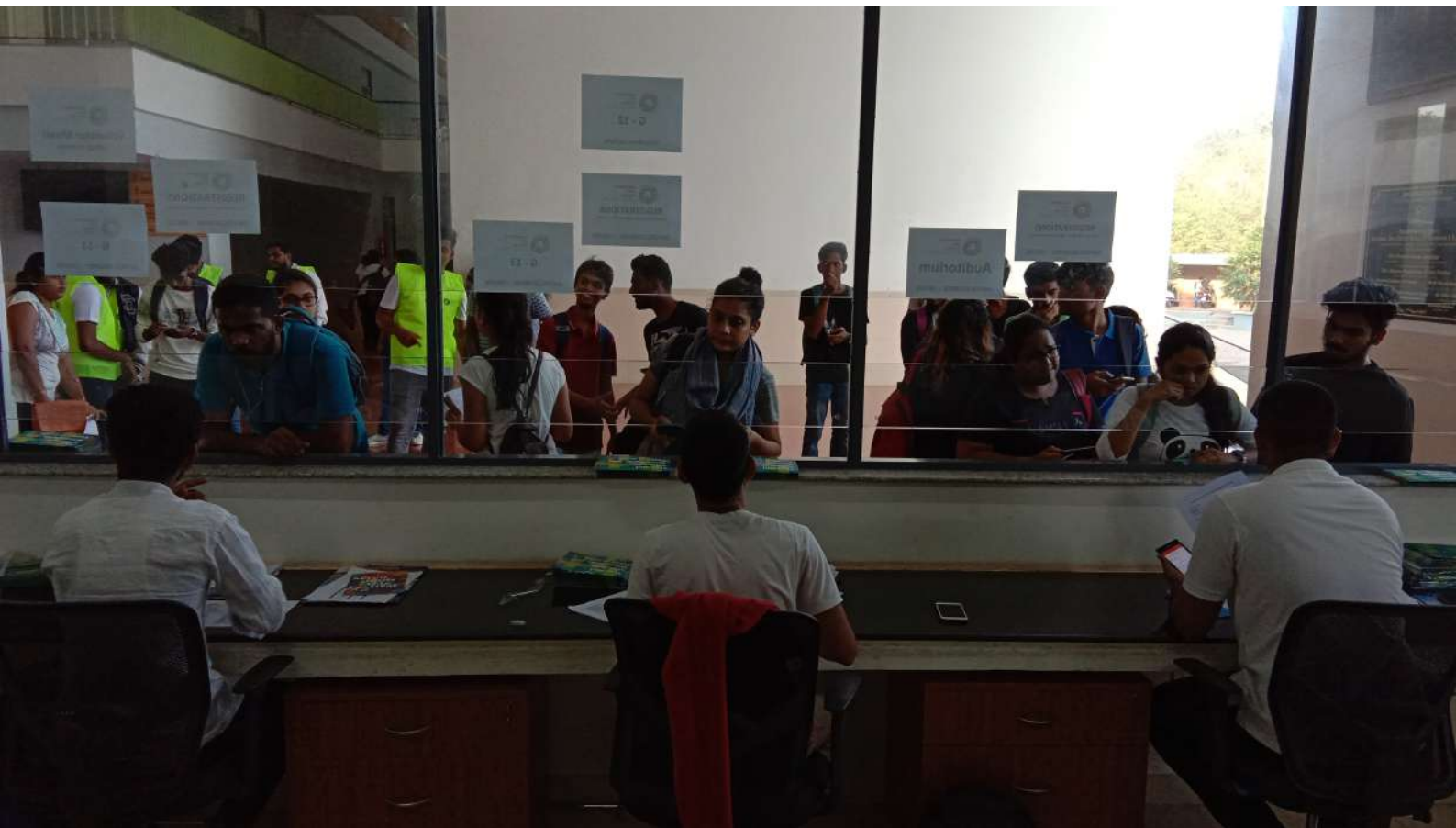

Whereas the aforesaid parties, hereinafter referred to collectively as *institutions*, recognize that academic collaboration will provide mutual benefit of promoting and facilitating research, have reached the following understanding:

1. Objectives of the MoU


- i. To establish a formal joint platform for promoting and facilitating research, namely, Cluster Research Centre in Commerce under the relevant provisions of Goa University ordinance.
- ii. To facilitate registration of Goa University recognized Ph.D. guides from the participating institutions with the Cluster Research Centre in Commerce.

Handwritten signatures and initials at the bottom of the page, including names like "Shree", "M", "Raj", "Shale", "Vest", "Manj", "Sury", and "Sury".

- iii. To enroll candidates for Ph.D. degree in the Cluster Research Centre under the relevant provisions of Goa University ordinance.
- iv. To undertake academic activities in the nature of workshops, seminars, talks, symposia, and similar under the banner of Cluster Research Centre in Commerce for the benefit of researchers and teachers.

2. Terms and Conditions of Collaboration and sharing of resources

- i. This collaboration is only for the purpose of establishment of Cluster Research Centre in Commerce under the relevant provisions of Goa University ordinance and would entail exchange of communication between the participating institutions only so far as required for effective functioning of the Cluster Research Centre in Commerce.
- ii. The Cluster Research Centre in Commerce shall be affiliated to Goa University only.
- iii. Only Goa University recognized research guides from both the institutions shall be allowed to guide through Cluster Research Centre in Commerce.
- iv. The responsibility of acquiring approval of Goa University for research guideship shall be that of individual teachers from the institutions.

The participating institutions shall consult together upon request by any of the institutions regarding any matter relating to the Cluster Research Centre in Commerce or this MoU and will endeavor jointly in a spirit of cooperation and mutual trust to resolve any difficulties or misunderstandings which may arise.



- xi. The ownership of any intellectual property arising out of research undertaken through Cluster Research Centre in Commerce shall be decided by the concerned individual researcher and his/her research guide. The Cluster Research Centre in Commerce itself shall not have any ownership rights on such intellectual property.
- xii. Both the institutions shall extend help in conducting activities of Cluster Research Centre in Commerce.
